

"Story of Two Brothers"

"But we raised our daughter properly in a Christian home, sent her to a Christian school, took her to church with us," The pastor and his broken hearted wife lamented. "And now that she is of age she has left our home to move in with an ungodly man!"

While we have heard many such stories from disappointed parents over the years, one quite vividly sticks in our minds. It is the story of two brothers raised by godly parents, never divorced. Both sons were home schooled, and not in touch with the outside ungodly world – a near perfect environment.

Yet in spite of the godly upbringing and knowledge of the Holy received by each boy from their parents, at a specific time the older son rose up in a fit of anger and killed his younger brother! This is the story of Cain and Abel.

$3\ principles$ we learn from the success and failure of sons of Adam.

By faith Abel offered a more excellent sacrifice than Cain, by which he obtained witness that he was righteous, God testifying of his gifts; and by it he being dead yet speaks –Hebrews 11:4. Genesis 4:1-12

Abel's sacrifice was by <u>faith</u> in God's <u>Word</u>. "more excellent sacrifice" Abel's sacrifice was strictly by faith. He had no written precedent since there is no other such recorded sacrifice. The only record was what God communicated to Adam and Eve, Cain and Abel's parents. In Genesis 3:15 & 21 God spoke to Adam and Eve by His actions. Here is what He demonstrated to the first parents:

- 1) For a sinner to stand before God he needed a *covering* (clothes).
- 2) Clothing of human manufacture was worthless.
- 3) God Himself must provide a covering.
- 4) The necessary covering could *only* be obtained by *death* (blood).

Abel's sacrifice was in the *right object*. "...he obtained witness that he was righteous..." The very first gospel messages ever preached. Life could only come out of death because of human sin. We or a substitute must pay the penalty for sin. Abel killed a lamb (?), offering it to God:

- 1) His sacrifice acknowledged God as *righteous*, separated from man.
- 2) His sacrifice acknowledged that he was *guilty* due death.
- 3) His sacrifice acknowledged God was *holy* must punish sin.
- 4) His sacrifice acknowledged God was <u>merciful</u> a substitute needed.
- 5) His sacrifice acknowledged he was looking for *acceptance* with God.
- 6) His sacrifice acknowledged a faith in the \underline{lamb} Lamb of God, Jesus.

Cain's Sacrifice was a sacrifice in the *wrong object***.** Earth fruit. Note: He came to God as a *believer* and *religious worshipper*. But he

absolutely refused to conform to God's will. Note especially that:

- 1) Cain's sacrifice (probably colorful) was a *bloodless* one. -Heb. 9:22
- 2) Cain's sacrifice was the fruit of his own labor. -Titus 3:5
- 3) Cain ignored the revealed *curse* of God on the *ground*. –Gen. 3:17
- 4) Cain despised knowledge of *God's grace* God's covering. -Gen.3:21

Cain refused to comply with the *revealed will* of *God*, even when given a *second chance* by the Lord –Gen. 4:6-7. Yet outwardly he came before the Lord to worship. This is called "the way of Cain" –Jude 11. It is the way of self-will, disobedience to God's plan, and evidence of religious hypocrisy. Cain was sincere in his worship-but he was sincerely wrong! As a result of Cain's arrogance and anger instead of finally doing right, he killed his righteous (accepted in God's sight) younger brother. Contrary to popular opinion today, God is particular in what sacrifice He will receive. Jesus was very exclusive when He said: "...I am the way, the truth, and the life, no one comes to the Father except by me" –John 14:6.

Abel offered a more excellent sacrifice because it was offered in obedience to God's plan. He offered it in *faith* in a *promise* of God, as he looked forward to the Lamb of God, who would take away sin of the world –John 1:29 (and Gen. 3:15 promise fulfilled). *"...he being dead yet speaks."* A voice from before the flood testifies that mankind can only approach God through the death of an innocent substitute. Abel got it right and was murdered by his religious brother. A similar martyrdom would take place 4,000 years later as our Savior would be crucified by self-righteous religious people.

Yet, belief in God's crucified Son is His exclusive salvation plan – Not our own labor, but in the Lamb of God who died for our sins. See Rom. 10:9, 10. Call upon the name of our Savior who died to save us! –Romans 10:13.

On the Light Side: Good Counsel for Today Make sure you test POSITIVE for FAITH.

Keep your DISTANCE from DOUBT. And ISOLATE from FEAR.

Quick "n" Easy Cheesy Banana Pudding

3 Bananas (approximately 1 cup

8 oz. Cream Cheese

 $\frac{1}{4}$ cup Heavy Whipping Cream

1 Tbs. Chia Seeds (optional)

1-2 Tbs. Powered Sugar (or pure Maple Sugar)

Pinch of fine Sea Salt

6 Vanilla Wafer Cookies

TOPPING (Optional)

Fresh Banana Slices

Whipped Topping or Cool Whip Chocolate Curls or Mini Chocolate Chips

In the bowl of an electric mixer, beat Bananas until mashed and only slightly lumpy. Add Cream Cheese and Heavy Cream. Beat on high speed until well blended, about 5 minutes. Scrape down sides, add Chia, Powdered Sugar or Maple Syrup and beat on high another 3 minutes. In the bottom of small dessert cups or a serving bowl place whole Vanilla Wafers. If using serving cups place $\frac{1}{2}$ cup of pudding over top of Wafer. If using serving bowl spoon pudding on top of Wafers. Place pudding in refrigerator for at least two hours or overnight to chill.

Before serving, if desired, top with thinly sliced Bananas and a dollop of Cool Whip, then garnish with chocolate curls or mini Chocolate Chips. -Laura Kurella


Never Felt Better
